Introduction

About the Programme

Welfare Sociology Master's Programme is an interdisciplinary study course that falls into three distinct parts.

The first of these addresses a variety of sociological issues within a broader socio-economic context, the second deals with the core social policy epistemological issues and the final one focuses on the research. Welfare Sociology Master's Programme meets the needs of both the EU and non-EU member states' students, with a consideration of rapid social changes in Europe and increasing globalization process.
