ORDER

ON THE APPROVAL OF THE PROVISIONS FOR REDUCING OR EXEMPTING TUITION FEES AND FEES NOT DIRECTLY RELATED TO THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE STUDY PROGRAM ON THE GROUNDS SPECIFIED IN PARAGRAPH 48.2 OF THE MYKOLAS ROMERIS UNIVERSITY FEE PAYMENT PROCEDURE

Acting in accordance with Paragraph 48.2 of the Mykolas Romeris University Fee Payment Procedure, approved by the University Council on 2 July 2025 by Resolution No. 1UT-12, and the implementation procedure of this paragraph approved by the Rector's Order No. 1I-215 of 29 July 2022, "On the approval of the Implementation Procedure for Paragraph 40.2 of the Mykolas Romeris University Fee Payment Administration Procedure Approved by the Council's Resolution No. 1UT-14 of 2 July 2022":

1. I hereby approve the Provisions for the Reduction or Exemption of Tuition Fees and Fees Not Directly Related to the Implementation of the Study Program on the Grounds Specified in Paragraph 48.2 of the Mykolas Romeris University Fee Payment Procedure (hereinafter – the Provisions) (attached).

2. I assign the Vice-Rector for Studies to supervise the implementation of the Provisions approved by this order.

3. I declare void:

3.1. The Rector's Order No. 1I-10 of 10 January 2025, "On the reduction or exemption of tuition fees and fees not directly related to the implementation of the study program on the grounds specified in paragraph 39.2 of the Mykolas Romeris University fee payment administration procedure";

3.2. The Rector's Order No. 1I-203 of 2 July 2025, "on the amendment of the Rector's order no. 1I-10 of 10 January 2025, 'on the reduction or exemption of tuition fees and fees not directly related to the implementation of the study program on the grounds specified in paragraph 39.2 of the Mykolas Romeris university fee payment administration procedure, by "supplementing it with paragraph 2.5.".

**PROVISIONS ON REDUCTION OR EXEMPTION OF TUITION FEES AND FEES NOT
DIRECTLY RELATED TO THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE STUDY PROGRAMME
ON THE BASES PROVIDED FOR IN PARAGRAPH 48.2 OF THE MYKOLAS
ROMERIS UNIVERSITY FEES PAYMENT PROCEDURE**

1. Based on Paragraph 48.2.1 of the Mykolas Romeris University fee payment procedure (hereinafter – the procedure), in order to provide support to Ukrainian citizens who have fled Ukraine to the Republic of Lithuania due to the military actions of the Russian Federation in Ukraine:

1.1. Ukrainian citizens who meet the following criteria may be exempted from the tuition fee:

1.1.1. those admitted to Mykolas Romeris University (hereinafter – the University) bachelor's studies in the 2022–2023 and 2023–2024 academic years who have been awarded partial state funding for studies at the University in accordance with national legislation;

1.1.2. those who studied at Ukrainian universities before 24 February 2022 and transferred to bachelor's or master's studies at the University between 24 February 2022 and 1 September 2022;

1.1.3. those admitted to the University's bachelor's studies in the 2023–2024 academic year but, due to objective reasons (such as not receiving a residence permit in Lithuania on time), did not receive partial state funding for studies at the University.

1.2. The tuition fee may be reduced for Ukrainian citizens who meet the following criteria and conditions:

1.2.1. those admitted to **bachelor's** studies at the University in the 2024–2025, 2025–2026, and 2026–2027 academic years shall receive, each semester for the entire period of studies, a study price 40% lower than the tuition fee approved by the Senate in the year of their admission;

1.2.2. those admitted to **master's** studies at the University in the 2025–2026 and 2026–2027 academic years under **cooperation agreements** with partners in Ukraine shall receive, each semester for the entire period of studies, a study price **30%** lower than the tuition fee approved by the Senate in the year of their admission;

1.2.3. those admitted to **master's** studies at the University in the 2023–2024 and 2024–2025 academic years shall receive, each semester for the entire period of studies, a study price **30%** lower than the tuition fee approved by the Senate in the year of their admission;

1.2.4. those admitted to **master's** studies at the University in the 2023–2024 and 2024–2025 academic years under **cooperation agreements** with partners in Ukraine shall receive, each semester for the entire period of studies, a study price **50%** lower than the tuition fee approved by the Senate in the year of their admission.

2. If the students referred to in subparagraphs 1.2.2–1.2.4 of the procedure receive funding from other institutions to cover the study cost, the discounts specified in these subparagraphs shall not apply.

3. Based on Paragraph 48.2.1 of the procedure, and in order to provide humanitarian assistance, students who hold refugee status in the Republic of Lithuania may be exempt from the tuition fee.

4. Based on Paragraph 48.2.2 of the procedure, and in order to increase the accessibility of quality university studies to citizens of developing countries and enhance the internationalization of studies at the University, the following may be exempt from the tuition fee:

4.1. 14 students who are citizens or permanent residents of the countries listed in subparagraphs 4.1.1–4.1.6 of these provisions, admitted in the 2026–2027 academic year to non-state-funded **bachelor's** studies at the University and selected for this funding under the competitive procedure set out in the University Senate Resolution No. 1SN-55 of 27 November 2025 “On the approval of the rules for admission of students and auditors to first-Cycle, second-Cycle, integrated, professional, and additional studies at Mykolas Romeris University in 2026” (hereinafter – the admission rules):

4.1.1. Ukraine – 5 students;

4.1.2. South Africa, Ghana, Zimbabwe, Kenya – 2 students;

4.1.3. Colombia, Brazil, Venezuela, Mexico – 2 students– 2 students;

4.1.4. Taiwan, Thailand, the Philippines, Mongolia, Indonesia – 3 students;

4.1.5. Georgia (Sakartvelo), Moldova – 1 student;

4.1.6. Uzbekistan, Tajikistan – 1 student.

4.2. Students admitted in the 2025–2026 academic year from the target countries listed in subparagraphs 2.1.1–2.1.7 of the Rector's order no. 1I-10 of 10 January 2025 “On the reduction or exemption of tuition fees and fees not directly related to the implementation of the study program on the grounds specified in paragraph 39.2 of the Mykolas Romeris University fee payment administration procedure,” under the conditions and procedure specified in this order;

4.3. Students admitted in the 2024–2025 academic year from the target countries listed in subparagraphs 2.1.1–2.1.8 of the Rector's Order No. 1I-125 of 18 June 2024 “On the Reduction or Exemption of Tuition Fees and Fees Not Directly Related to the Implementation of the Study Program on the Grounds Specified in Paragraph 39.2 of the Mykolas Romeris University Fee Payment Administration Procedure,” under the conditions and procedure specified in this order;

4.4 Students admitted in the 2023–2024 academic year from the target countries listed in subparagraphs 2.1.1–2.1.6 of the Rector's order No. 1I-231 of 26 October 2023 “on the reduction or exemption of tuition fees and fees not directly related to the implementation of the study program on the grounds specified in paragraph 39.2 of the Mykolas Romeris University fee payment administration procedure,” under the conditions and procedure specified in this order;

4.5. **5 students** who are citizens or permanent residents of the European Union, admitted in the 2026–2027 academic year to the University's joint or double-degree master's study programs and selected following the procedure set out in Part VIII of the admission rules.

5. Students referred to in these provisions are exempt from the tuition fee or part of it each semester after assessing whether they have no academic debts, and—students admitted from the 2025–2026 academic year onward—whether they have confirmed their place of residence in the Republic of Lithuania in accordance with the procedure established in the University Rector's order No. 1I-210 of 4 July 2025 “On the approval of the procedure for ensuring the participation of foreign students holding a temporary residence permit in the Republic of Lithuania for study purposes in the study process.” Accordingly, students are not exempted from the tuition fee or do not receive a reduction in the tuition fee if they:

5.1. being admitted from the 2025–2026 academic year, finish the semester with one or more academic debts and have not confirmed their place of residence in the Republic of Lithuania;

5.2. in case being admitted before the 2025–2026 academic year, finish the semester with one or more academic debts.
