CHRISTOPHE CLERC

Christophe Clerc is a Paris-based lawyer specializing in corporate law, corporate governance, insolvency proceedings and collective labor relations. An alumnus of Sciences Po Paris, he teaches at Sciences Po on power structures in firms. He has issued several reports for the European Commission, has been assisting the European Parliament and is a member of the Informal Company Law Expert Group (ICLEG) for the European Commission.

He was a member of the Issuers' Committee of the French Financial Markets Authority (AMF) for nine years. He is the co-author of a book on codetermination (*Les chances d'une codetermination à la française*, Prisme, 2013), the author of a report for the International Labour Organisation on corporate governance models in the world (*Modèles de gouvernance de l'entreprise: Structure, diversité, évaluation et prospective*, 2020), the co-author of a book on ownership throughout history and in various cultures (*Propriété. Le sujet et sa chose*, Seuil, 2023), and the co-author of *Political Economy of the Firm: Authority, Governance, and Economic Democracy* (Routledge, 2024).

He has also co-directed two series for the French-German TV channel ARTE, on ownership and money respectively. He is currently writing a book on money. He has successfully proposed or assisted several laws in France.
