AIRPORTS IN LITHUANIA

Lithuania has three main international airports. Depending on your airline, you will likely land at one of the following:

Vilnius International Airport (VNO)

- The largest airport, located in the capital
- Most major airlines (Lufthansa, LOT, SAS, airBaltic) and low-cost carriers (Ryanair, Wizz Air) fly here.



Kaunas International Airport (KUN)

- Located closer to Marijampole
- Primary hub for Ryanair

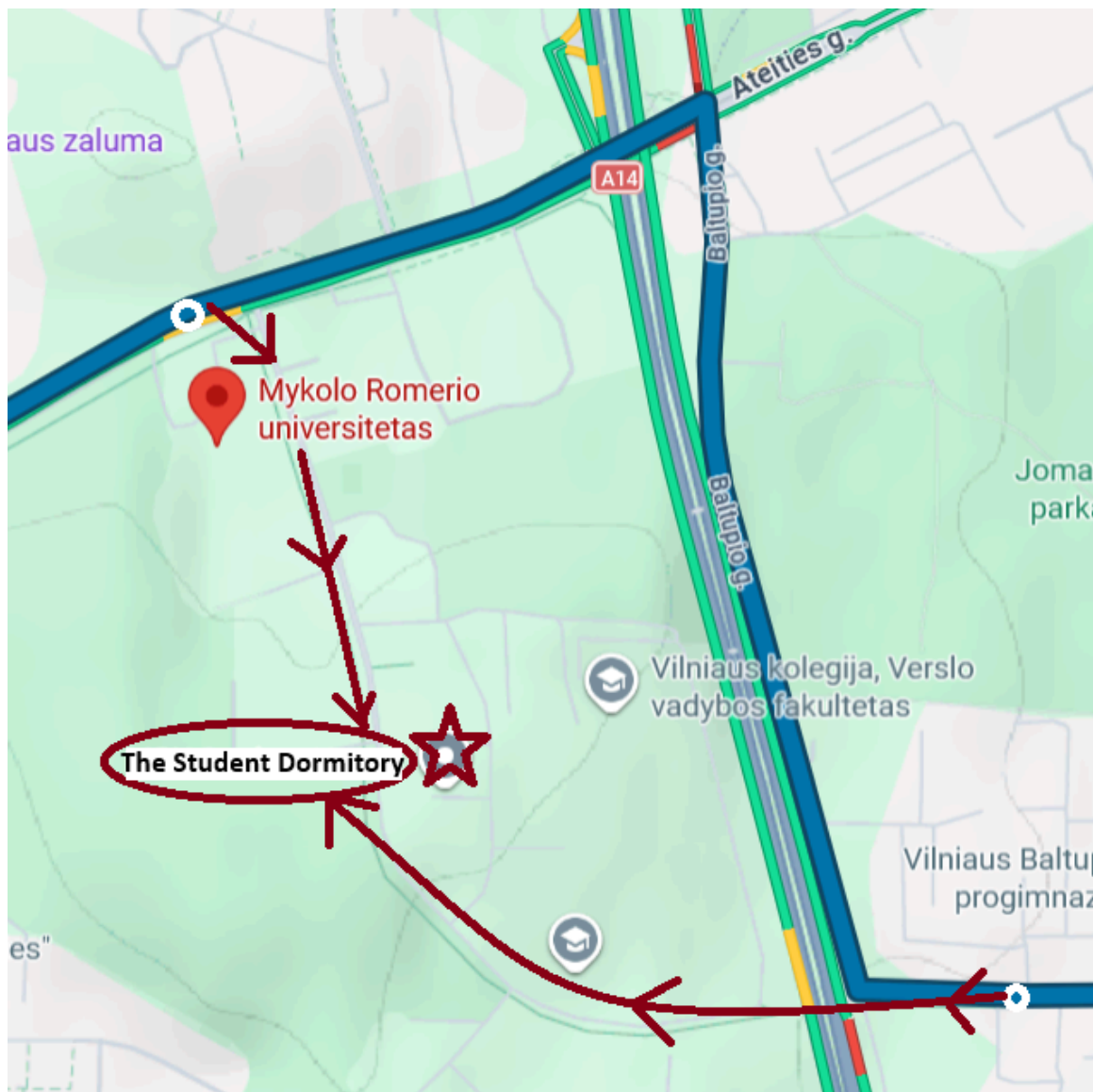
Palanga International Airport (PLQ)

- Located on the coast
- Furthest from Marijampole



Use **Trafi** app to move around the Vilnius city.

FROM THE AIRPORT TO STUDENT DORMITORY



At the Airport stop which is in front of the arrival hall ("ORO UOSTAS") please take a bus No 3G and change it to a Bus No. 10 in a bus stop "ZALIASIS TILTAS" (it is approximately in the middle of the route). Destination stop is "DIDLAUKIO".

From the Airport it is possible either to take a taxi (but it is expensive and often overcharged... and probably you would pay about 30 eur for a trip from the Airport to the MRU Dormitory) or it is possible to arrive by Public transportation (Duration of travel ~45 minutes).



MRU DORMITORY

Rooms can be offered at MRU Dormitory (located at 5 minutes walk to the main University building). Room prices differ depending on the accommodation style. Close by there are shopping centres or supermarkets “IKI”, “LIDL”, “RIMI”, “NORFA”.



If you wish to stay at MRU Dormitory, please inform a MRU representative to check the availability.

From the Dormitory to the city centre (and old town) there is a direct connection by Public transportation (bus No. 10). The closest bus stop to the dormitory is **DIDLAUKIO**.

TRANSPORTATION IN VILNIUS

Public transportation in Vilnius is well developed and can get you just about anywhere in the town. Only in extra case you may need to use taxi.

We recommend booking a taxi by sing mobile app Bolt (<https://bolt.eu/cities/vilnius/>) - charges are lower.

Tickets and public bus

Tickets for buses or trolleybuses can be bought from the Trafi App (1,00 eur for 30 min, 1,25 eur for 60 min., 7,50 eur for 1 day, etc.) and they are to be activated at the buses or trolleybuses upon entrance AND they are valid until the time of activated ticket runs out. If your travel continues, you should activate new ticket. If you do not have smart phone, or prefer using separate card for E-tickets, it is possible to obtain from the Press kiosk at the Airport an E-tickets card for 1,5 eur ("JUDU kortelė")

and top it up with electronic tickets which are valid according to the timing - 30 minutes, 60 minutes, 1 day, 3 day, 10 day, etc.... With a valid ticket in the card, properly activated on board of public vehicle, if necessary, it is possible to change the public transport for free and for an unlimited number of journeys within the time of the e-ticket.



There is always an option to purchase a 60-minute ticket (1,25 eur) using your contactless payment card at the validator in the vehicle.

MRU LOCATIONS

MRU Public Security Academy

- Address: S. Dariaus ir S. Girėno g. 100, Kaunas

The Mykolas Romeris University (MRU) Public Security Academy campus is distinct from the main MRU hub in Vilnius, as it is primarily based in Kaunas. It serves as the national center for training highly qualified professionals in law enforcement, border protection, and civil protection.



Unlike a standard liberal arts campus, the Public Security Academy is built for practical, high-stakes training. The campus includes specialized rooms for simulating crime scenes, pre-trial investigation exercises, and public order maintenance. Fitness and physical endurance are core to the curriculum.

The campus features gyms, specialized training halls for martial arts/self-defense, and outdoor physical training areas designed for officers-in-training.

MRU Sudovian Academy

- Address: P. Armino g. 92, LT-68125, Marijampolė

Sudovian Academy is the newest major addition to Mykolas Romeris University (MRU), officially becoming part of the university on October 1, 2024.

It was formed following the merger of Marijampolė College (Marijampolės kolegija) with MRU. This transformation turned Marijampolė into a "university city," ensuring that students in the Sūduva region can pursue high-level university degrees without moving to the capital.



The campus is increasingly becoming a center for STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math) education. It recently launched international courses like "STEAM Education Without Borders" through the European Reform University Alliance (ERUA).

THINGS TO SEE IN VILNIUS

Vilnius Old Town

Senamiestis, the lively, well-preserved Old Town, is renowned for historic buildings in a range of styles, from baroque and Gothic churches to the neoclassical Town Hall. Medieval Gediminas Castle Tower offers city views, and Vilnius University dates from the 16th century.

Vilnius Cathedral

The Cathedral Basilica of St Stanislaus and St Ladislaus of Vilnius, also known as Vilnius Cathedral is the main Catholic cathedral in Lithuania. It is situated in Vilnius Old Town, just off Cathedral Square.

Gediminas Castle Tower is the most frequently visited branch of the National Museum of Lithuania. Its exhibition invites visitors to learn about the history of Vilnius as the centre of the Grand Duchy of Lithuania.

Turn off lights, unplug devices, and use water responsibly in your accommodation.

TRIPS AROUND MRU

MRU to Trakai

39 km from MRU.

Trakai is a town in southeastern Lithuania, west of Vilnius.

Built in the 14th century. A historical town, the castle and the beautiful natural surroundings are what makes Trakai one of the most popular tourist attractions in the country.

ONE - Day TRIP



MRU to Kaunas

A city in south-central Lithuania 108 km from MRU. You can visit the Kaunas Castle, a castle was built back in the 14th century. This is the oldest castle and the second-largest city in Lithuania.

How to get there?

To get to the bus station from the airport, take a quick train (7 mins) or the #1/2 bus.

To reach Kaunas and Trakai, use:

The city is known for embracing urban creativity, and you'll spot large murals and clever pieces scattered across old walls, underpasses, and even rooftops.

Weekend TRIP

MRU to Šiauliai

Šiauliai is a city in northern Lithuania. From MRU it's 208 km. It's a gateway to the Hill of Crosses, just northeast. In the city center, the Aušros Museum's several branches include the Photography Museum, with old Lithuanian photos and a camera obscura, and the Bicycle Museum. You can arrive to the city by using LTG Link train from Vilnius.



A place of pilgrimage, the site was established in the 19th century as a symbol of resistance to Russian rule. It now includes more than 100,000 crosses. It's around 10km far from Šiauliai.

Marijampolė

Marijampolė is the capital of Marijampolė County in the south of Lithuania, bordering Poland and Russian Kaliningrad Oblast, and Lake Vištytis. Marijampolė is the seventh-largest city in Lithuania and the sixteenth-largest city in the Baltic States.



From Vilnius Airport

- Distance: ~140 km.
- By Bus: You can take a direct bus from Vilnius Bus Station. To get to the bus station from the airport, take a quick train (7 mins) or the #1/2 bus.
 - Travel time: 2.5 to 3 hours.
 - Check schedules: autobusubilietai.lt
- By Train: Take a train to Kaunas, then transfer to a train heading to Marijampolė.
 - Check schedules: ltglink.lt

From Kaunas Airport to Marijampole

- Distance: ~75 km.
- By Bus: Take a city bus or taxi to the Kaunas Bus Station (Kauno autobusų stotis). From there, buses to Marijampole run frequently (approx. every hour). The trip takes about 1 hour.
- By Taxi/Bolt: A direct ride costs approximately €60–€80.

MRU to Tallinn

Tallinn, Estonia's capital on the Baltic Sea, is the country's cultural hub. It retains its walled, cobblestoned Old Town, home to cafes and shops, as well as Kiek in de Kök, a 15th-century defensive tower. Its Gothic Town Hall, built in the 13th century and with a 64m-high tower, sits in historic Tallinn's main square. St. Nicholas Church is a 13th-century landmark exhibiting ecclesiastical art.



Vilnius is 600km from Tallinn. To get to the capital city Tallinn, you can use Flixbus and Lux Express buses.

MRU to Riga



Riga, Latvia's capital, is set on the Baltic Sea at the mouth of the River Daugava. It's considered a cultural center and is home to many museums and concert halls. The city is also known for its wooden buildings, art nouveau architecture and medieval Old Town. The pedestrian-only Old Town has many shops and restaurants and is home to busy Livu Square.

Vilnius is around 300 km far from Riga. You can arrive there by using LTG Link train. Other alternatives are Flixbus and Lux Express buses.

WIFI, ELECTRICITY, CURRENCY

At Mykolas Romeris University, wireless internet is available across the entire campus. There are four Wi-Fi networks:

- “Eduroam”
- “MRU Guest”
- “MRU”
- “MRU Visitor”

All networks require login access.

International students are recommended to use:

- “Eduroam” – log in using your home university credentials;
- “MRU Visitor” – the password is available on the first floor of the university.



Lithuania operates on a 230 V supply voltage and 50 Hz. The fuses in Lithuania are 2 pole, please make sure your plugs suit the available sockets (or do not forget your travel adaptor) for your electronic devices.

In Lithuania the official currency is EURO and you may pay in cash only in EURO.

The most popular online banks:

- Revolut
- Paysera

Online banks are recommended because of the quick account setup and fewer costs.



HEALTH INSURANCE

- Mandatory for your entire stay (Schengen area coverage).
- Minimum coverage: €30,000, including emergency care & repatriation.
- EU citizens: Bring European Health Insurance Card (EHIC).
- Non-EU citizens: Get insurance before arrival or ask the International Office for guidance.
- Medical visits: Pay upfront & claim reimbursement from your insurer.
