REGULATIONS ON THE AWARDING OF SCHOLARSHIPS AND STUDY SUPPORT AT MYKOLAS ROMERIS UNIVERSITY

I. GENERAL PROVISIONS

1. The Regulations on the Awarding of Scholarships and Study Support at Mykolas Romeris University (hereinafter – the Regulations) govern the allocation of funds designated for scholarships and study support, the types and amounts of scholarships and study support, as well as the procedures for their award and payment.

2. These Regulations have been drafted in accordance with the Law on Higher Education and Research of the Republic of Lithuania, other legal acts of the Republic of Lithuania, the Statute of the University, and the resolutions of the Council and the Senate of the University.

3. For the purposes of these Regulations, the following terms shall have the meanings set out below:

3.1. Scholarship means non-repayable financial support granted to a student.

3.2. Scholarship Fund means a fund established from State budget appropriations and the University's own funds.

3.3. Academic Unit means a faculty or an institute, school, or academy that is not part of a faculty.

3.4. Head of an Academic Unit means the dean of a faculty or the head of an institute, school, or academy that is not part of a faculty.

3.5. Student and Staff Support Committee means a committee established by order of the Rector and operating in accordance with the rules of procedure approved by the Rector, which submits recommendations to the Rector concerning the award of one-time incentive scholarships or social scholarships provided for in these Regulations.

3.6. Tuition Fee means the fee for one academic year or one semester of studies in a particular study programme or field of study as determined and approved by the Senate of the University.

3.7. International Ambassador of the University (hereinafter – the International Ambassador) means a student who is a member of the University's International Ambassadors Network and performs representative, information-related, and other functions provided for in the Regulations governing the activities of the University's International Ambassadors Network.

3.8. Patron means a natural or legal person who has established a scholarship.

3.9. Other terms used in these Regulations shall be understood as defined in the Statute of the University and other legal acts of the University.

4. Scholarships shall not be awarded to students:

4.1. who have academic debts, except in the case of social scholarships, one-time incentive scholarships, and patron-funded scholarships where the conditions governing the award of the patron-funded scholarship provide otherwise;

4.2. who have been granted academic leave;

4.3. whose studies have been suspended;

4.4. within one calendar year following the imposition of a disciplinary sanction;

4.5. who have already received an incentive scholarship for the same period after returning from suspended studies, academic leave, or following the resumption of discontinued studies;

4.6. in other cases provided for by legal acts.

5. Payment of a scholarship shall be discontinued:

5.1. when the student is removed from the University's register of students;

5.2. when a disciplinary sanction is imposed by order of the Rector or the Head of the Academic Unit;

5.3. when academic leave is granted;

5.4. when studies are suspended;

5.5. in other cases provided for by legal acts.

6. Unless otherwise provided by legal acts, scholarships shall be paid on the 25th day of each month.

II. TYPES OF SCHOLARSHIPS AND STUDY SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS AND THE PROCEDURE FOR THEIR AWARD

Incentive scholarship

1. An Incentive Scholarship shall be awarded to the highest-achieving state-funded and non-state-funded first-cycle and second-cycle students of the University.

2. An Incentive Scholarship may also be awarded to applicants from designated foreign countries applying for admission to non-state-funded first-cycle and second-cycle study places. The list of designated foreign countries shall be approved by the Rector upon the proposal of the Vice-Rector for Studies.

3. The amount of the Incentive Scholarship shall be 1.5 basic social benefits (hereinafter – BSB).

4. The highest-achieving students within an Academic Unit shall be determined each semester based on their academic performance, namely the weighted average of grades obtained during the most recent examination session, which shall be no lower than 8.0. Where students have the same weighted average for the most recent examination session, the overall weighted average of the preceding examination session shall be taken into account. If this is also identical, the admission competitive score shall be used.

5. Taking into account the State budget funds allocated for Incentive Scholarships, the Head of the Academic Unit shall, by order, approve the number of scholarships by study cycle by 10 September for the autumn semester and by 10 February for the spring semester. Incentive Scholarships from the Academic Unit Scholarship Fund shall be awarded by order of the Head of the Academic Unit. Incentive Scholarships from the University's Own Funds Scholarship Fund shall be awarded by the Rector upon the proposal of the Head of the Academic Unit. Incentive Scholarships for applicants from designated foreign countries shall be awarded from the University's Own Funds Scholarship Fund by the Rector upon the proposal of the Vice-Rector for Studies.

6. Students returning from partial studies abroad shall be awarded Incentive Scholarships after the recognition of the semester results obtained during their studies abroad. The scholarship shall be paid retroactively from the beginning of the relevant semester.

7. An Incentive Scholarship shall be awarded twice per academic year: for the autumn semester (September–January) and for the spring semester (February–June). The scholarship shall be paid on a monthly basis.

8. An Incentive Scholarship shall not be awarded during the first semester of the first year of studies, except in the case provided for in Paragraph 8 of these Regulations.

Study support for doctoral students

9. Study support for a state-funded third-cycle (doctoral) student enrolled in a full-time study mode shall be awarded in accordance with the procedure established by the Government of the Republic of Lithuania.

10. Doctoral students enrolled in the first year of full-time state-funded doctoral studies shall be awarded study support in the amount of 19.0 basic social benefits (hereinafter – BSB). Doctoral students enrolled in the second and subsequent years of full-time state-funded doctoral studies shall be awarded study support in the amount of 22.0 BSB.

11. Study support for doctoral students shall be awarded once per year at the beginning of the doctoral student's academic year. The support shall be paid on a monthly basis.

12. If a doctoral student enrolled in full-time state-funded third-cycle studies fails to comply with the doctoral study plan, the Rector shall, within five working days from the date on which this circumstance is established, issue an order suspending the provision of study support to that doctoral student. Where it is established that the doctoral student has resumed compliance with the doctoral study plan, the Rector shall, within five working days from the date on which this circumstance is established, issue an order reinstating the provision of study support.

13. Study support for doctoral students shall be awarded from the Doctoral Scholarship Fund by the Rector.

Study support for students of pedagogical study programmes

14. Study support for students enrolled in first-cycle study programmes in the field of Education leading to the award of a teaching qualification and in professional study programmes (hereinafter – Pedagogical Study Programmes) shall be awarded in accordance with the procedure established by the Government of the Republic of Lithuania.

15. Study support shall be awarded to students of Pedagogical Study Programmes (hereinafter – students) who are enrolled in state-funded study places and have no academic debts.

16. The amount of study support shall be:

1.05 basic social benefits (BSB) for students admitted before 1 May 2020;

300 EUR per month for students admitted from 1 May 2020 until 1 June 2022.

17. Study support shall be awarded twice a year, subject to the receipt of State budget funds allocated for this purpose, by order of the Rector upon the proposal of the Head of the Academic Unit. The support shall be paid monthly throughout the academic year. It shall be granted for the entire duration of the studies, but not longer than the duration of the respective study programme.

18. Where a student has academic debts, the Rector shall immediately, but no later than within five working days from the date on which this circumstance is established, adopt a decision to terminate the provision of study support.

One-time incentive scholarship

19. A One-time Incentive Scholarship may be awarded to a first-cycle or second-cycle student of the University:

19.1. upon the student's initiative, for active research, social or cultural activities, or for outstanding achievements in research, social or cultural activities that enhance the reputation of the University;

19.2. upon the initiative of an Academic Unit or an administrative unit, for active research, social or cultural activities, or for outstanding achievements in research, social or cultural activities that enhance the reputation of the University;

19.3. upon the student's initiative, for outstanding sporting achievements or active participation in sports that enhance the reputation of the University;

19.4. upon the initiative of the Health and Sports Division, for outstanding sporting achievements or active participation in sports that enhance the reputation of the University;

19.5. for good academic performance.

20. A One-time Incentive Scholarship for the activities or achievements referred to in Subparagraph 25.1 of these Regulations shall be awarded as follows:

20.1. The student shall submit a reasoned application to the Head of the Academic Unit requesting the award of a One-time Incentive Scholarship and indicating the requested amount. The application shall be accompanied by a description of the student's cultural, research or social activities. Where the application is submitted on the basis of outstanding achievements in cultural, research or social activities, documents evidencing such achievements shall also be attached.

20.2. The student's application shall be registered by the Academic Unit and, together with the proposal of the Head of the Academic Unit indicating the proposed scholarship amount, shall be submitted for consideration within seven (7) calendar days to:

20.2.1. the Student and Staff Support Committee, where the One-time Incentive Scholarship is to be awarded from the Centralised Scholarship Fund or the University's Own Funds Scholarship Fund;

20.2.2. the Scholarship Committee of the Academic Unit, where the One-time Incentive Scholarship is to be awarded from the Academic Unit Scholarship Fund.

20.3. Having examined the application, the Student and Staff Support Committee shall submit its recommendation to the Rector, while the Scholarship Committee of the Academic Unit, composed by order of the Head of the Academic Unit of at least one student representative of that Academic Unit and no fewer than three employees of the Academic Unit, shall submit its recommendation to the Head of the Academic Unit for the award of a One-time Incentive Scholarship, indicating the proposed scholarship amount.

20.4. A One-time Incentive Scholarship from the Centralised Scholarship Fund or the University's Own Funds Scholarship Fund shall be awarded by the Rector upon the recommendation of the Student and Staff Support Committee. A One-time Incentive Scholarship from the Academic Unit Scholarship Fund shall be awarded by the Head of the Academic Unit upon the recommendation of the Scholarship Committee of the Academic Unit.

21. A One-time Incentive Scholarship for the activities referred to in Subparagraph 25.2 of these Regulations shall be awarded as follows:

21.1. An Academic Unit or an administrative unit, having obtained the student's consent, shall submit a reasoned proposal to the Student and Staff Support Committee requesting the award of a One-time Incentive Scholarship and indicating the proposed scholarship amount. Documents evidencing the student's active participation or achievements shall be attached to the proposal.

21.2. Having examined the proposal, the Student and Staff Support Committee shall submit its recommendation to the Rector regarding the award of the One-time Incentive Scholarship, indicating the proposed scholarship amount.

21.3. A One-time Incentive Scholarship from the Centralised Scholarship Fund or the University's Own Funds Scholarship Fund shall be awarded by the Rector upon the recommendation of the Student and Staff Support Committee.

22. A One-time Incentive Scholarship for the activities or achievements referred to in Subparagraph 25.3 of these Regulations shall be awarded as follows:

22.1. The student shall submit a reasoned application to the Head of the Health and Sports Division requesting the award of a One-time Incentive Scholarship and indicating the requested scholarship amount. The application shall be accompanied by a recommendation from the student's sports club or coach.

22.2. The student's application shall be registered by the Health and Sports Division and, together with the proposal of the Head of the Division indicating the proposed scholarship amount, shall be submitted to the Student and Staff Support Committee for consideration within seven (7) calendar days.

22.3. Having examined the application, the Student and Staff Support Committee shall submit its recommendation to the Rector regarding the award of the One-time Incentive Scholarship, indicating the proposed scholarship amount.

22.4. A One-time Incentive Scholarship from the Centralised Scholarship Fund or the University's Own Funds Scholarship Fund shall be awarded by the Rector upon the recommendation of the Student and Staff Support Committee.

23. A One-time Incentive Scholarship for the activities or achievements referred to in Subparagraph 25.4 of these Regulations shall be awarded as follows:

23.1. The Health and Sports Division, having obtained the student's consent, shall submit a reasoned proposal to the Student and Staff Support Committee requesting the award of a One-time Incentive Scholarship and indicating the proposed scholarship amount. Documents evidencing the student's active participation or achievements shall be attached to the proposal.

23.2. Having examined the proposal, the Student and Staff Support Committee shall submit its recommendation to the Rector regarding the award of the One-time Incentive Scholarship, indicating the proposed scholarship amount.

23.3. A One-time Incentive Scholarship from the Centralised Scholarship Fund or the University's Own Funds Scholarship Fund shall be awarded by the Rector upon the recommendation of the Student and Staff Support Committee.

24. A One-time Incentive Scholarship for the good academic performance referred to in Subparagraph 25.5 of these Regulations shall be awarded as follows:

24.1. At the end of a calendar year, a One-time Incentive Scholarship may be awarded to the highest-achieving students from the unused portion of the Academic Unit Scholarship Fund.

24.2. A One-time Incentive Scholarship from the Academic Unit Scholarship Fund shall be awarded by the Head of the Academic Unit upon the recommendation of the Scholarship Committee of the Academic Unit.

25. A One-time Incentive Scholarship of up to 8.0 basic social benefits (BSB) may be awarded to first-cycle and second-cycle students for outstanding achievements in sports, culture, research or other activities that enhance the reputation of the University. For active participation in sports, culture, research, social or other activities that enhance the reputation of the University, a One-time Incentive Scholarship of up to 3.0 BSB may be awarded.

26. A One-time Incentive Scholarship of up to 30.0 BSB may be awarded to third-cycle students. The conditions and procedure for awarding One-time Incentive Scholarships to third-cycle students shall be approved by the Rector.

27. The total amount of One-time Incentive Scholarships awarded to a first-cycle or second-cycle student during one semester shall not exceed 8.0 BSB. For a third-cycle student, the total amount shall not exceed 30.0 BSB.

28. A One-time Incentive Scholarship for the same achievement may be awarded only once.

29. A One-time Incentive Scholarship shall not be awarded in addition to students receiving the Professor Mykolas Romeris Named Scholarship.

Professor Mykolas Romeris named scholarship

30. The Professor Mykolas Romeris Named Scholarship shall be awarded to state-funded and non-state-funded first-cycle and second-cycle students of the University for excellent (or, in exceptional cases, very good) academic performance and outstanding achievements in sports, culture, research or social activities.

31. The amount of the Professor Mykolas Romeris Named Scholarship shall be 4.0 basic social benefits (BSB).

32. The Professor Mykolas Romeris Named Scholarship for the same achievements may be awarded only once.

33. The Professor Mykolas Romeris Named Scholarship shall be awarded twice per academic year: for the autumn semester (September–January) and for the spring semester (February–June). The scholarship shall be paid on a monthly basis.

34. A student receiving the Professor Mykolas Romeris Named Scholarship shall not be awarded an Incentive Scholarship or a One-time Incentive Scholarship for academic performance in addition to the Named Scholarship.

35. The Professor Mykolas Romeris Named Scholarship shall not be awarded during the first semester of the first year of studies.

36. Proposals for candidates for the Professor Mykolas Romeris Named Scholarship shall be submitted to the Senate Study Commission by 1 October for the autumn semester and by 1 March for the spring semester by the councils of the University's Academic Units, the University Student Representation, the local ELSA chapter, or the Student Scientific Society. Students may also submit their own candidacies directly to the Senate.

37. The following documents shall be submitted when nominating a candidate for the Professor Mykolas Romeris Named Scholarship:

37.1. a certificate of the student's academic performance;

37.2. a description of the student's outstanding achievements in sports, culture, research and social activities;

37.3. copies of the student's published research papers;

37.4. recommendations from at least two professors or associate professors of the University;

37.5. other documents demonstrating the student's achievements in academic, research, social, artistic and/or sporting activities.

38. Within five working days after the deadline for submitting nominations, the Senate Study Commission shall select up to ten candidates for the Professor Mykolas Romeris Named Scholarship and submit the list of candidates to the Senate.

39. The Professor Mykolas Romeris Named Scholarship shall be awarded by the Senate upon the recommendation of the Senate Study Commission.

International ambassador scholarship

40. The International Ambassador Scholarship shall be awarded to International Ambassadors for the proper and responsible performance of the duties specified in the Regulations on the Activities of the University's International Ambassadors Network.

41. The amount of the International Ambassador Scholarship shall be up to 3.0 basic social benefits (BSB).

42. The total amount of International Ambassador Scholarships awarded to one student during a semester shall not exceed 8.0 BSB.

43. The International Ambassador Scholarship shall be awarded in January of each academic year for the autumn semester and in June for the spring semester.

44. An International Ambassador applying for an International Ambassador Scholarship shall, no later than 10 January or 10 June, submit an activity report to the designated employee of the Communication and Marketing Centre.

45. The International Ambassador Scholarship shall be awarded by the Rector upon the proposal of the Head of the Communication and Marketing Centre.

Patron-funded scholarship

46. A Patron-funded Scholarship may be awarded to a University student selected in accordance with the conditions established by the Patron.

47. A Patron-funded Scholarship may be awarded as a one-time scholarship or paid periodically. The amount, method of payment and duration of the scholarship shall be determined by the Patron.

48. Where the recipient of a Patron-funded Scholarship is a student selected in advance by the Patron, the conditions for awarding and paying the scholarship shall be established by a tripartite agreement concluded between the Rector or the Rector's authorised representative, the Patron, and the scholarship recipient.

49. A Patron-funded Scholarship shall be established by a cooperation agreement signed by the Patron and the Rector or the Rector's authorised representative.

50. A competition may be organised for the award of a Patron-funded Scholarship. Applicants shall submit documents demonstrating that they meet the conditions specified in the competition, in accordance with the requirements established by the Patron.

51. The exact deadline and place for submitting documents, as well as the specific conditions of the competition, shall be published on the University's website.

52. Where necessary, the applications submitted for a Patron-funded Scholarship shall be considered by a working group established by order of the Rector and consisting of an odd number of members. The working group shall include representatives of Academic Units, representatives of the Student Representation, and, if so requested by the Patron, the Patron or the Patron's representative. The working group shall adopt its decisions by a majority vote of the members participating in the meeting.

53. Information on the grounds for the termination of payment of a Patron-funded Scholarship shall be provided by the Academic Unit in which the scholarship recipient is studying to the Academic Affairs Centre, which shall notify the Patron.

54. A Patron-funded Scholarship shall be awarded by order of the Rector upon the proposal of the Head of the Academic Unit or the Head of the working group referred to in Paragraph 58 of these Regulations.

Group coordinator scholarship

55. A Group Coordinator Scholarship may be awarded to first-cycle, second-cycle and professional study students for the proper and responsible performance of the duties of a Group Coordinator as defined in the Group Coordinator Regulations.

56. The amount of the Group Coordinator Scholarship shall be 0.5 basic social benefits (BSB).

57. The Group Coordinator Scholarship shall be awarded by order of the Rector upon the proposal of the Head of the Academic Unit.

58. The Group Coordinator Scholarship shall be awarded and paid once per semester.

Scholarship for company sergeants, group leaders and deputy group leaders

59. A Scholarship may be awarded to state-funded and non-state-funded students enrolled in the study programmes in Police Activities, Law and Police Activities, or Law and State Border Protection, and, from 2026, in the study programmes in Law and Law Enforcement or Law and Internal Service, who properly and responsibly perform the respective duties.

60. The amount of the Scholarship for a Company Sergeant shall be 0.4 basic social benefits (BSB).

61. The amount of the Scholarship for a Group Leader shall be 0.3 BSB.

62. The amount of the Scholarship for a Deputy Group Leader shall be 0.2 BSB.

63. A student receiving a Scholarship for a Company Sergeant, Group Leader or Deputy Group Leader shall not be eligible for a Group Coordinator Scholarship.

64. A Scholarship for Company Sergeants, Group Leaders or Deputy Group Leaders shall be awarded from the Academic Unit Scholarship Fund by order of the Head of the Academic Unit, and from the University's Own Funds Scholarship Fund by order of the Rector upon the proposal of the Head of the Academic Unit.

65. For students enrolled in state-funded study places, the Scholarship shall be awarded once per semester and paid on a monthly basis. For students enrolled in non-state-funded study places, the Scholarship shall be awarded once per semester, and the awarded amount shall be deducted from the student's tuition fee.

Social scholarship

66. A Social Scholarship may be awarded to a University student in cases of financial hardship, the death of a close family member, illness, natural disaster, or other exceptional circumstances.

67. The amount of the Social Scholarship shall range from 2.0 to 30.0 basic social benefits (BSB).

68. University students wishing to receive a Social Scholarship shall submit an application to the Head of the Academic Unit by 14 September in the autumn semester and by 14 February in the spring semester. The application shall specify the purpose for which the Social Scholarship is requested: to cover tuition fees, accommodation fees in the student residence, or living expenses. In the event of a disaster or other exceptional circumstances, an application may be submitted at any time. The application shall include the student's personal bank account details, except where the scholarship is requested to cover tuition fees or accommodation fees in the student residence.

69. The following documents shall be submitted together with the application:

69.1. a certificate confirming the composition of the student's family;

69.2. a certificate of the student's insured income for the preceding three months or a certificate confirming unemployment;

69.3. certificates of the insured income received by the student's parents (guardians) or spouse during the preceding three months, or income derived from individual activity, or certificates confirming unemployment;

69.4. other documents supporting the application.

76. University students arriving from foreign countries shall submit, together with the application, the documents referred to in Paragraph 75 issued either in the Republic of Lithuania or in another country.

77. Students' applications shall be registered by the Academic Unit and, together with the proposal of the Head of the Academic Unit, shall be submitted to the Student and Staff Support Committee for consideration no later than 22 September in the autumn semester and 22 February in the spring semester. The proposal of the Head of the Academic Unit shall indicate the proposed amount of the Social Scholarship and the purpose for which it is proposed to be awarded.

78. Having examined the application, the Student and Staff Support Committee shall submit a recommendation to the Rector regarding the award of a Social Scholarship, taking into account the insured income of the student's family, the student's academic performance, other relevant circumstances, and the funds allocated for Social Scholarships in the University's expenditure estimate for the respective year. The Student and Staff Support Committee may recommend that the Rector increase or decrease the amount of the Social Scholarship proposed by the Head of the Academic Unit.

79. Where a Social Scholarship is awarded to cover tuition fees or accommodation fees in the student residence, the University's Finance Office shall make the payment directly to cover the relevant fee. Where a Social Scholarship is awarded to cover living expenses, it shall be transferred to the student's personal bank account.

80. A Social Scholarship shall be awarded by order of the Rector upon the recommendation of the Student and Staff Support Committee.

Early admission scholarship

81. An Early Admission Scholarship may be awarded to a state-funded or non-state-funded student who participated in the University's early admission procedure and fulfilled all early admission requirements set out in the Admission Rules approved for the year of the student's admission.

82. The amount of the Early Admission Scholarship shall be up to 14.0 basic social benefits (BSB). The specific amount of the scholarship and the number of scholarships to be awarded for the respective admission year shall be determined by the Rector.

83. The Early Admission Scholarship shall be paid in equal instalments during the last month of each semester throughout the student's period of study, provided that the student's study agreement has not been terminated.

84. The list of students eligible for an Early Admission Scholarship shall be approved by the Rector upon the proposal of the Admissions Committee. The Early Admission Scholarship shall be awarded to the student by order of the Rector.

Admission Scholarship

85. A Targeted Admission Scholarship may be awarded to first-cycle and second-cycle students enrolled in state-funded and/or non-state-funded study places who have been admitted to priority study programmes, fields of study, Academic Units or study places designated by the Rector for the respective academic year.

86. The purpose of the Targeted Admission Scholarship is to encourage admission to study programmes, fields of study or Academic Units that are of strategic priority to the University and to enhance their attractiveness and competitiveness.

87. The amount of the Targeted Admission Scholarship shall be up to 5.0 basic social benefits (BSB). The specific amount of the scholarship, the number of scholarships to be awarded, and the conditions for their payment for each academic year shall be determined by the Rector.

88. The list of students eligible for a Targeted Admission Scholarship shall be approved by the Rector upon the proposal of the Admissions Committee.

89. Where a student terminates their studies before the scholarship payment date, the right to receive the unpaid portion of the Targeted Admission Scholarship shall be forfeited.

90. In accordance with the procedure established by the Rector, a student may also be granted other one-time targeted admission incentive measures, the total annual value of which, calculated for all students collectively, shall not exceed 340 basic social benefits (BSB).

III. STRUCTURE OF THE SCHOLARSHIP FUND

91. The Scholarship Fund shall consist of:

- 91.1. the Centralised Scholarship Fund for first-cycle and second-cycle students;
- 91.2. the Academic Unit Scholarship Fund;
- 91.3. the Doctoral Scholarship Fund;
- 91.4. the University's Own Funds Scholarship Fund.

92. The Centralised Scholarship Fund shall consist of up to 20 per cent of the State budget appropriations allocated for incentivising first-cycle and second-cycle students.

93. The Academic Unit Scholarship Fund shall consist of not less than 80 per cent of the State budget appropriations allocated for incentivising first-cycle and second-cycle students.

94. At least 80 per cent of the Academic Unit Scholarship Fund shall be allocated to Incentive Scholarships for outstanding academic performance, while up to 20 per cent may be allocated to One-time Incentive Scholarships.

95. The share of the Scholarship Fund allocated to each Academic Unit shall vary depending on the number of state-funded students enrolled in that Academic Unit during the relevant semester. The allocated share shall be distributed proportionally according to the number of state-funded students enrolled in first-cycle and second-cycle studies.

96. The Doctoral Scholarship Fund shall consist of State budget appropriations allocated for incentivising state-funded third-cycle students.

97. The University's Own Funds Scholarship Fund shall be approved annually by the University Council when approving the annual income and expenditure budget.

98. The detailed allocation of funds from the Academic Unit Scholarship Fund to Academic Units shall be approved by the Rector during the first week of each semester. With the consent of the Student Representation, these funds may be reallocated for other University needs.

99. The following scholarships shall be awarded to first-cycle and second-cycle students from the Centralised Scholarship Fund:

- 99.1. One-time Incentive Scholarship;
- 99.2. Professor Mykolas Romeris Named Scholarship;
- 99.3. Early Admission Scholarship;
- 99.4. Targeted Admission Scholarship.

100. The following scholarships and study support shall be awarded to first-cycle and second-cycle students from the Academic Unit Scholarship Fund:

- 100.1. Incentive Scholarship;
- 100.2. Study Support for Students of Pedagogical Study Programmes;
- 100.3. One-time Incentive Scholarship for the highest-achieving students and for state-funded students for the achievements specified in Subparagraphs 25.1–25.4 of these Regulations;
- 100.4. Group Coordinator Scholarship.

101. The following shall be awarded to state-funded third-cycle students from the Doctoral Scholarship Fund:

- 101.1. Study Support for Doctoral Students;
- 101.2. One-time Incentive Scholarship.

102. The following shall be awarded from the University's Own Funds Scholarship Fund:

102.1. One-time Incentive Scholarship for the achievements specified in Subparagraphs 25.1–25.4 of these Regulations to recipients of non-state-funded study scholarships;

102.2. Professor Mykolas Romeris Named Scholarship to recipients of non-state-funded study scholarships;

102.3. International Ambassador Scholarship;

102.4. Social Scholarship;

102.5. Group Coordinator Scholarship to recipients of non-state-funded study scholarships;

102.6. Scholarship for Company Sergeants, Group Leaders and Deputy Group Leaders to recipients of non-state-funded study scholarships.

103. A Patron-funded Scholarship shall be awarded and paid to scholarship recipients from funds allocated for this purpose by institutions, support funds or private individuals.

IV. FINAL PROVISIONS

104. Scholarships shall be transferred to the student's personal bank account on the 25th day of each month.

105. Other scholarships may also be awarded to University students in accordance with the procedure established by the legal acts of the Republic of Lithuania.

106. In the event of any inconsistency between these Regulations and the legal acts of the Republic of Lithuania, the legal acts of the Republic of Lithuania shall prevail.
